Alzheimer's Association Speaker Jenny Furman

Information was shared on the need for community awareness of Alzheimer's. When asked for a show of hands the majority of attendees raised their hand to indicate they knew someone or were a caregiver for someone with Alzheimer's. She discussed that dementia is an umbrella term that includes Alzheimer's. The disease is progressive and fatal with death at times coming 4-8 years after a diagnosis. Research indicates that Black and Hispanic population are more disproportionate in being diagnosed and 2/3 of Americans living with Alzheimer's are women. She gave several handouts on warning signs, support groups and healthy living having an impact on the brain staying healthy.
